Trump's Bedminster golf club could also lose its liquor license, N.J. attorney general says

President Donald Trump might lose his liquor licenses all over New Jersey.

If the state's recent attempt to revoke the liquor license at Trump's Colts Neck golf club goes through, the organization's other licenses will also be pulled, New Jersey state Attorney General Gurbir Grewal said Friday.

That would include Trump's golf club at Bedminster, where the president has spent lots of time over the past two summers.

Trump's club at Pine Hill would also be affected.

Although Grewal declined to speculate if that would happen, he defended the Division of Alcohol Beverage Control.

"I trust their judgement," Grewal said at an unrelated news conference in Newark.

The Colts Neck club allegedly served an intoxicated customer in 2015. That man later drove drunk and got into an accident that killed his father, according to a published report.

Grewal said that the state's decision was made for no reason other than "egregious violations" that threatened public safety. This was "normal, routine enforcement action," he said.

A message left with the Trump Organization seeking comment was not immediately returned.
